



Throughout this hike, you may admire a forest of cork oaks, known as the *suberaie*, as well as a chestnut grove. You may enjoy some shade before climbing to an outstanding viewpoint. From there, contemplate the slopes of the Massif des Maures which fall into the Mediterranean.

In winter, some sunrises will enchant you with their flamboyant colours.

You will cross small hamlets along your way. La Galine, Les Vernades, Embaude...

In terms of etymology: "La Galine" comes from the word "Volaille" [poultry]; "Les Vernades" comes from "verne", which means "alder". The alder is a tree that grows along the river banks. "Embaude" originates from an old family name (1445) Baude.

Walk along and cross small streams that flow into the Garde and Giscle rivers. These two streams, often dry on the surface in summer, have formed the Grimaud plain.



## DID YOU KNOW?

History of the road between La Garde-Freinet, Grimaud and Cogolin.

Until 1866, the road connecting La Garde-Freinet to Cogolin did not cross the village of Grimaud, but connected La Garde-Freinet directly to Cogolin.

This road was vital for the villages because it allowed the circulation of goods (wood, oil, wine, cereals, cork, etc.) between Le Luc and Saint-Tropez

For 97 years, from 1769 to 1866, the *Grimaudois*, name of the inhabitants of Grimaud, campaigned for the creation of a road connecting Grimaud directly to Cogolin. It was only in 1865, following a detailed study of the advantages and inconveniences, that the project to build this road was finally accepted!


The area where the tourist office, the post office and the Beausoleil hall are currently located is directly related to the creation of this new road.

Up to 5,500 animals (sheep, goats, donkeys and cows) graze on our lands and help prevent wildfires.


#### What to do near a herd?

- Walk as far as you can around the herd and keep your distance.
- Keep your dog on a lead.

#### In the presence of Patous (big herding dogs):

- Stop until they identify you;
- Stay calm, do not threaten them, do not pet them.



- Starting point Rue Saint-Jean in front of the Tourist Office.
  Follow the direction of the Pontevès Car Park and go down the street until the roundabout.
- 2 Cross the roundabout and go up Chemin du Défens in front of the cemetery until the stop sign.
- At the stop sign, cross the road, then at the junction, follow the Ancien chemin du Plan de la Tour for 1 km. At the Mas des Lauriers, continue on the left-hand path.
- At the end of the path, stay on the right-hand side of the road for 100 metres. Then cross the road and go up Chemin du Curnier. On reaching the letterboxes, turn right and go up the path.

- 5 At the fork in the road, take the descending path on the right for 600 metres.
- 6 At the crossroads with Road D75, take Chemin de la Galine opposite. Stay on this small paved road for about 7 km. Follow the signs. This path crosses several small hamlets, please respect the peace and quiet of the inhabitants and their pets.
- At the crossroads, take the track no. E703 on the right, known as "Piste des Vernades". The path crosses a small stream. Continue uphill for 250 metres.

  Frequent presence of beehives. Be careful!
- Take the small steps cut into the slope on the left. Then, after 50 metres, continue to the right and climb up to a small path. Follow it for about 250 metres.

The path is located near a hamlet, please respect the peace and quiet of its inhabitants and their pets.

Frequent presence of beehives. Be careful!

- 9 On reaching the small shed on the left, continue straight ahead. Leave the vineyards on the right and take the left-hand path in the forest which ascends over 300 metres to an intersection at the end of the forest.
- Continue on the main path to the left and after less than 100 metres, on reaching the oratory, go down the track no. E701 called "Piste de l'Oratoire", to the right. Follow it for about 2 km.
  - \*Here the oratory is an ancient stone building of modest size, consisting of a niche with a small religious statue.
- Follow the markings of the descending track.

  Respect the private property of the inhabitants of Embaude.
- 12 Cross the brook by a ford with a concrete pipe and turn left onto a second ford. Continue on the small paved

road for 800 metres to the roundabout called 'rond-point de la Libération' on Road RD 558.

To get to the centre of Grimaud, take the road on the left which goes up to the village, 500 metres ahead.

Return by the same route.
